Dear friend of the Athens YMCA,


We have the special privilege of hosting Clarke County School District special needs students at our pool on Fridays for their physical education class. They alternate classrooms and grade levels so that a variety of students are exposed to the water. But the children do visit multiple times during a semester and it's a joy to see them grow.

One teacher said that trips to the YMCA pool have been an integral part of teaching their adapted students about the real world. It provides a safe and fun learning opportunity where students can engage in an activity that they otherwise might not be able to, while simultaneously exposing them to aspects of the community.

Students learn safety outside of the classroom by actively engaging in their environment at the Y. Students learn how to respond appropriately to others in public, about community helpers (Lifeguards), and pool safety. Students learn responsibility by bringing their pool items to school, taking them with them on the bus, and changing in a public locker room while at the YMCA.
